Good Beer Guide 2016

With the summer approaching the Good Beer Guide will be invaluable - to find a decent pint, somewhere to have lunch, or even stay overnight.

We still have a few copies left at £10.00 each if you pick up the Guide from Jim Flynn at a branch event or his home (please ring first). All copies posted to an address in the branch area will cost £11.00 each (still a saving on the official price including p&p). Beer Scores - We Need You!

Please help us choose our 25 **Good Beer Guide** entries by scoring your beers at a wide range of branch pubs. You can do this online via <u>www.whatpub.com</u>, log in, look up the pub, then score it on the page (you need to be logged-in to score). With a smartphone you can score your beers from the pub!

All of our cask ale pubs are on the database and can be selected by name and location. Scoring of real ale is in halves from **0.5** for **very poor** beer to **5.0** for a (very rare) **perfect pint**, with **3.0** meaning "good" as in "Good Beer Guide".

- Poor beer should be taken back if it's replaced and taken off sale, score only the replacement.
- Scores of 4 and above should only be given sparingly.
- If there's no cask ale on your visit, put in a notional <u>zero</u> score (WhatPub takes this to mean "no real ale"). On beerscoring.org.uk, tick the "No Real Ale" box. You're not actually scoring keg beer as worthless, just saying there was no cask to score.

If you prefer to score on paper, scorebooks (for **SSM CAMRA** pubs) are available at meetings or branch events. Enjoy your research! - Peter Butler, <u>pubsofficer@ssmcamra.co.uk</u>
